NOTICE OF RACE

The Harris Series will be hosted by California Yacht Club (CYC) on Saturday and Sunday, August 28-29, 2010. CYC is located at 4469 Admiralty Way, Marina del Rey, CA 90292, phone 310.823.4567. Information about CYC and this regatta is available at www.calyachtclub.com.

1. RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the *2009-2012 Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 The Organizing Authority (OA) is CYC.
- 1.3 RRS 62.2 and 66 will be changed to shorten the time limit for filing requests for redress and requests to reopen a hearing. The changes will appear in full in the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.4 RRS 63.7 will be replaced with: "If there is any conflict between the Sailing Instructions and this Notice of Race, the Sailing Instructions shall apply."
- 1.5 RRS 82 will not apply.
- 1.6 US SAILING Prescriptions to RRS 60, 63.2 and 63.4 will not apply.
- 1.7 The PHRF of Southern California (SoCal PHRF) "Marine Industry Racer" rule will not apply to this event.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 This regatta is open to one-design keelboats and boats rated 180 or lower under SoCal PHRF. Boats with ratings outside this range may petition the Regatta Chairman for a class.
- 2.2 Each boat must (1) be entered by an individual who is a member of a yacht club or sailing association that is a member of US SAILING (or their own National Authority) and (2) fulfill the eligibility requirements of the class in which she will compete. - 2.3 Each entrant must submit a completed [CYC Entry Form](#) and entry fee no later than 1900 hours on Friday, August 27, 2010. Star class only: On the entry form please include the names of both skipper and crew.
- 2.4 Late entries, with a \$15 late fee, will be accepted only with the prior approval of the Regatta Chairman.

3. CLASSES

- 3.1 Classes will be established based on entries received as of 1900 hours on Friday, August 27, 2010 with a minimum of five (5) paid entries necessary to establish a class. One-Design boats that have not established a class will race in the PHRF fleet and must comply with PHRF requirements.
- 3.2 Classes, class flags and order of starts will be posted no later than 2000 hours on Friday, August 27, 2010.

4. FEES

The entry fee is \$40 for members of US SAILING with proof of membership, \$45 for non-members, when received by 1900 hours on Friday, August 27, 2010. Information about joining US SAILING is available at www.ussailing.org or at 800.877.2451. There will be a \$15 late fee for entries accepted after that time (see NOR 2.4).

5. SCHEDULE

Five (5) races are scheduled: three (3) on Saturday and two (2) on Sunday. Without posting a change to the schedule of races, the Race Committee (RC) reserves the right to run one more race on Sunday if fewer than the scheduled number of races are completed on Saturday. The RC, at its discretion, may run fewer total races.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be posted at www.calyachtclub.com by Wednesday, August 25, 2010 and will be available at the CYC front desk by 1800 hours on Friday, August 27, 2010.

7. VENUE

The racing area will be on Santa Monica Bay and use the Marina del Rey Racing Marks located southwest of the Marina del Rey breakwater.

8. THE COURSES

Courses will be primarily windward / leeward. [Marina del Rey Course Chart 16](#) will be used.

9. SCORING

9.1 The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply except that all scores will count.

9.2 PHRF classes will be scored using Area B Buoy Ratings. Boats from outside of Area B will have Area B adjustments applied as available.

9.3 One (1) race must be completed to constitute a regatta.

10. RADIO COMMUNICATION

While on the water, the RC may communicate with competing boats via VHF radio, including starting penalties.

11. PRIZES

11.1 The first place Martin 242 will be awarded the **Dr. Bob Crum Trophy**.

PHRF class winners will have their names inscribed on the **Fred Harris Libation Cup**.

One-Design class winners will have their names inscribed on the **Commodore's Trophy**.

The above perpetual trophies shall remain on display at CYC.

11.2 Take home prizes for each class will be awarded based on the number of entries received.

11.3 Prizes will be awarded at CYC as soon as practicable after the last race on Sunday.

12. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers (organizing authority, host yacht club, race committee, protest committee, sponsors, and any others acting in an official capacity for this event) from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
