

The CYC website now has a reciprocity page that makes it easy to arrange for a letter of introduction to be sent to the 150-plus yacht clubs (not to mention the hundreds of city clubs that come with our LAAC partnership) around the world with which we have formal reciprocity agreements. nifty new tool, please look online (you must log into the members-only side of the website) at “Reciprocal Privileges” under the “Our Club” heading or ask the front desk for a ‘how to use’ flyer.

I have had some of my best travel experiences while utilizing reciprocals, sometimes even when not arriving by boat. Recently, Mike and I were vacationing in London and were able to arrange high tea at the Royal Thames Yacht Club. When we had our boat in the Pacific Northwest,

we were able to arrange guest docking at the Royal Vancouver Yacht Club at both their Stanley Park and English Bay locations, and we docked overnight at the Orcas Island Yacht Club guest dock on our way through the San Juan Islands.

While reciprocity is a fabulous bonus, do remember that it is set up as a give and take process. If your boat is docked in the CYC anchorage, be sure to notify the dock office when you will be away from your slip. That way CYC has additional capacity if someone is passing through and requests a night or two to visit our great Club and experience CYC’s hospitality. It also serves as a float plan on file in case you are overdue.

Again, please join us at the Club on March 11, and also out on the water, where I always enjoy seeing our Club burgee flying proudly. ⚓

# Competition Fund: 20 Years of Support

**A**s the CYC Competition Fund reaches its 20th year, its goals remain unchanged. The Fund continues to provide financial support to our members as they prepare for and participate in regional, national, and international competition.

In 2016, the Fund supported a diverse group of sailors and rowers, with highlights including:

- CYC member's team in the Race to Alaska
- Junior sailors competing in USODA Team Trials and the Optimist North American Championship
- CYC sent two teams to the International Women's Keelboat Championship, and competed in the Lipton Cup and Linda Elias Women's One Design interclub challenges
- Junior rowers competed in the US Rowing Youth National Rowing Championship
- Coaching sessions for our keelboat sailors

The Competition Fund coach boat was used throughout the year, both in coaching for our adult and junior sailors, and with on-the-water judging at the US Sailing Junior Olympics Festival.

Our goals for 2017 carry forward from what we supported in 2016:

- To work with the Challenge chair to ensure that well-prepared teams represent CYC at prestigious challenge events, and with the Junior Committee to develop our most promising young competitors.
- To encourage members to compete in major regional, national, and international events. Junior and adult members participating in sailing, rowing, or predicted log events are eligible for financial support to cover a variety of expenses, with coaching being the highest priority.
- To encourage the advancement of our active CYC racing fleets by supporting clinics and coaching sessions.

To request a grant from the Fund, members must submit a request form (available on the Member's Only section of

our website) which outlines their training, goals, and projected expenses for the event they plan to participate in, and a current resume. A committee reviews each request on its own merit and provides a grant to assist the member in achieving those goals. Funding can be provided for coaching, travel expenses, and various fees.

The 2017 Competition Fund charge of \$36 is included on your March

statement. This is a voluntary contribution which is the sole source of funding for the Competition Fund. The 2017 Competition Fund Committee includes S/C Craig Leeds, Marylyn Hoenemeyer, Port Captain Tim Clarke, and Chair Sam Haythorn. On behalf of all of the dedicated CYC rowers and sailors training and racing locally and around the world, thank you for your continued support. ♣

# "A Man Called Ove" Hate Him, Love Him, Never Forget Him!

**A** surprising, touching, humorous, altogether delightful novel, Fredrik Bachman's "A Man Called Ove" focuses on the cliché "the neighbor from hell," and reveals a tragic, truly remarkable figure worthy of our understanding, attention, and affection. Ove is a curmudgeon whose routines are upended when a Middle Eastern family moves in next door.

Marjorie Drubner began our February 2 Book Mates luncheon discussion by immediately clearing up any confusion over the Swedish pronunciation of the title character's name: it's not Ove, it's oooveh. She then proceeded to provide background on the author and the novel, a best-seller in Sweden, dismissed by American critics, but ultimately selling millions of copies here once readers discovered it.

The lively exchange touched on themes of love, loss, friendship, parental influences, petty bureaucracy, life's purpose, and the real meaning of being a good neighbor. Told with humor and pathos, the novel also makes sharp observations about tolerance toward immigrants and the pitfalls of quick judgment.

Ove is the kind of irritating individual we've all met at

some point in our lives, one we've usually dismissed, without examining what made him so unpleasant. Despite his rigid, principled, too practical attitude and his ongoing battle with stupidity and ignorance, Ove's initial negative behavior soon changes ... or does it? Does he change or does the reader's perception of him change? Bachman's novel makes us look deeper. Marjorie ended the discussion with a humorous quiz: How Ove are you?


