In 1967, the clubhouse we use today was formally dedicated and has been instrumental in the lives of many members and nonmembers, with Club events, regattas, rowing events, dock parties, weddings, memorials, and baby showers.

Thinking onward to our future, my hope is that we will continue to carry on our founders' goals and aspirations. We have so much to look forward to in our 100th year. While these "times they are a-changing," one thing that remains abundantly clear is the Club is made up of amazing people with an undying love of the water, our community, and all that CYC has to offer. Whether it be racing, rowing, cruising, power boating, paddle boarding, kayaking, dining, drinking with friends, playing paddle or pickleball, bridge, or mah jongg, there is something for everyone's desire at our home away from home.



Members and Memories

Members are the lifeblood of our Club and have been the central force in our activities and success since CYC's founding 100 years ago. As we celebrate our centennial milestone, we'll



highlight some memories in our collective history. This month, Honorary SEO Patty Hathaway takes us back 60 years as she shares her recollections.

n the early 1960s, before the 10 and 90 freeways were completed, and when Admiralty Way was an unpaved road meandering through open fields and marshland whose only inhabitants were the occasional jackrabbit, Charles Hathaway had already been hard at work on reactivating California Yacht Club, which had been paused due to World War II. He and Patty envisioned how the development of the new harbor, which became Marina del Rey, would be a perfect location for the Club. Charles led the effort to reestablish CYC, first on paper and then in leased space at the Sheraton Hotel (currently the Marina del Rey Hotel) while negotiations took place on a suitable permanent site for the new clubhouse at the head of the main channel. The dining room was originally planned to be at sea level, but that was reconsidered with the realization that due to tidal changes the view would be enhanced by having the main entrance and dining on the upper level. Thus, the motor court with a circular driveway and location of the central coral tree were elevated with the importation of soil all the way from Beverly Hills.

In 1964, while the new CYC building was under construction and meetings were in the hotel, a small group of about 15 women headed by Irene Tanner and Robin Hill formed the Women's Auxiliary, with Robin Hill as the first Executive Officer. When the new facilities were formally dedicated in 1967, Laurette Johnson was EO. From the early days, the women planned and hosted

many activities including monthly luncheons, weekly bridge lessons, and special events such as the annual Birthday Ball to commemorate the Club's founding in 1922. As is the case now, the Women's Association took the lead in providing hospitality for Opening Day each year and in assisting with regattas. At the time of the opening of the clubhouse in Marina del Rey, it was unusual for private clubs to allow women into the bar area, but from the start CYC was envisioned as a family club, so the use of accordion-fold panels to screen the men-only bar from 5 to 7 p.m. was shortlived. It took a little longer, but CYC's Epicurean Society eventually welcomed women as well.

In 2007 Patty Hathaway was recognized by the CYCWA and E/O Michele Caylor with the well-deserved title Honorary Staff Executive Officer. Over the years she has been a very active and enthusiastic participant in Club and family activities. Patty was aboard the support boat when, in celebration of his 50th birthday in 1976, then-LAAC President Charles Hathaway rowed from Catalina to the guest dock at CYC aboard his dory *Fritz*, which was named after S/C Eugene "Fritz" Overton, CYC's second Commodore in1923 and first Commodore of the Club's new era in 1961. That event led to the establishment of the rowing program at CYC. In the power yacht Starr, Charles and Patty joined by family and friends for various segments of the trip, traveled for more six months on a memorable voyage down the West Coast, through the Panama Canal, and up the East Coast on the shoulder of the 1998 Atlantic hurricane season. Some of Patty's favorite Club events have been CYC's family cruises at the Ballast Point facility in Catalina Harbor, as well as annual special events such as Opening Day and the Commodores Ball.



However, the Silver Fleet had many general recalls and postponements. We ended up cancelling the day because the weather and waves were too much. The race committee cancelled the last day because the weather was forecasted to storm. So, we packed up the boats and had the awards ceremony on Friday.




J/70 West Coast Winter Series January 15 and 16





Women, Wind and Stone "Island of Sea Women," by Lisa See

his historical fiction novel explores the life of Young-sook, now an old woman peacefully collecting seaweed on a rocky beach. However, when she is approached by a Korean-American family, Young-sook is forced to reflect upon her youth, and the horrors of the Jeju revolts of World War II.

Young-sook's reflection takes the reader into the world of sea women (divers) where the women are the bread winners and the men maintain the children and households. The novel is set over many decades, beginning during a period of Japanese colonialism in the 1930s and 1940s, followed by World War II and the Korean War and its aftermath. Two friends, Young-sook and Mi-ja, survivors of countless dives and developing the closest of bonds, are torn apart by forces outside their control. It pushes their friendship to the breaking point.

The evening event was the first live gathering at the Club for the Happy Hour Book Club since 2019. Moderated by Executive Officer Connie Webster, those in attendance discussed the deep meanings in the novel, including a multitude of emotions elicited by the author including, pain, trauma, hate, and anger. The group summed up that the theme was "best friends for life." We unanimously agreed this is a must-read book.

Those in attendance enjoyed seeing old friends, and making new friends while being treated to themed food and drink. It was a memorable evening for all.






