



A TAG AND A FLAG ...not to nag, but...

What is a dinghy tag?

When CYC members go to Howlands there are two items that you must have to use the anchorage and go ashore, particularly if you wish to use the dock. The camp monitors cove traffic year round and although anyone can pick up a mooring for the night and pay the mooring fee, the beach is private. Half of it is camp property and the other half property of LAYC.

We CYC cruisers now have an arrangement with LAYC that allows us to use the shore facility year round, weekday or at weekends. Please read the document on the cruising page to understand how the dock access protocol works.

So, on the dock flags flying are important: Red flags (no docking right now), yellow (ok to drop off/pick up but do not stay) and green flags (tie up welcomed).

We must all take two items with us if we plan to go ashore at Howlands: a tag to tie to your dinghy and your CYC burgee for your big boat, *sail or power*. The tag can be picked up at our front desk where you can also purchase burgees if you do not already have one. Please do not lose your tag as it identifies your dinghy for camp monitoring purposes and we will have the individual number on file.
